

COME FOLLOW ME

When I was growing up, my Catholic friends would tell me that their church was the one true church, the church that Christ founded. Being raised as a Presbyterian, I met that statement with skepticism. Even today, as a fully initiated and practicing Catholic, let alone a member of the clergy, I still have a tough time with that statement.

Yes, it is true that Christ founded His church. And through Apostolic succession, we have the Catholic

Church today. But is this what Jesus had in mind when he first called His disciples.

Yes it is, but I don't think He was thinking about the overall structure of the What He really church. wanted is you, the people who sit in the pews to be His church. You who come together to worship, to help one another, and to help those on the outside in need, you are the church.

Consider that Catholic Charities in the US is the 3rd largest charity in the US in terms of monies given to help those in need. And it is supported by you, the people in the pews. As He called us to do, take care of the poor and needy.

Catholic Hospitals in the US have 18% of the hospital beds but provide services to more of the poor and indigent that any hospital system, other than county hospitals. And these hospitals were started and run by people just like you. As He called us to do,

take care of the sick and lame.

And since it is Catholic Schools' week, we should-

n't forget them. Matthew Kelley made a statement that \$12 billion a year is spent to teach Catholic School students. If all the Catholic schools closed, it would cost \$18 billion a year to educate those children in the public schools. And there would be no increase in monies as parochial school parents already pay to support the public The schools are schools supported by you, the peo-



ple in the pews. As He called us to take care of the children.

So while the Church may not be exactly like Christ envisioned, the people are. Being Catholic means being universal in the love and support of those in need. That is what Christ wanted when He first said to His disciples, "Come after me and I will make you fishers of men."

Faith and Prayer

Liturgy 101: Memorial

A memorial is a day of celebration on the church calendar. It ranks below solemnities and feasts. Some memorials are so minor that they are optional. The others are obligatory.

If a memorial falls on a day of higher rank—a Sunday, for example—it is not observed at the liturgy that year. Falling on a weekday, however, an obligatory memorial will always be observed. Optional memorials may be celebrated or ignored.

On a memorial day the readings at Mass are generally those of the usual weekday. Optional readings are supplied in the lectionary for each memorial, but these are not required. In some cases, when the saint of the day is mentioned in the New Testament, the reading for the memorial is obligatory. This happens, for example, with Mary Magdalene.

The collect will always be proper to the memorial. The prayer over the offerings, the preface, and the prayer after communion may also pertain to the memorial. The priest vests in a color associated with the saint of the day, whether white or red.
